Paper [2] suggests that the counsellors play important role in order to assist the students to choose a good career, however, the effects or influence of the counsellor's effort on the career choice of students was low but it is most required in today's time.

In the book [3] author describes that career counselling not only helps workers' in career construction, it also helps them to design successful lives and to live purposeful lives – it also explores new theoretical approaches and interventions. It provides guidance on how to advance entrepreneurship and help students to develop critical thinking, curiosity, creativity, collaboration, and communication skills. In this way, the book promotes innovation in career counselling and helps in showing the right path that can help students to 'grow' rather than merely 'survive' in difficult times.

For study [4] a sample of 240 professionals were selected randomly and classified according to their profession. The sample consists of Engineers, Doctors, Chartered Accountants, Managers, Architects, Software Engineers, Interior Decorators, Dress Designers, Teachers and Lawyers. All selected persons were interviewed and tested for the effects of career counselling with the help of a self-prepared assessment. Collected data were tabulated, converted into percentages and comparatively analyzed which results in a lack of proper guidance to them at their early stage of choosing a career.

A two-year project [5] has yielded awareness of the collaboration between schools and work organisations. They present the results of desk research on 17 performed studies, four case studies and 34 interviews. Results show that collaboration between schools and organizations take place because of divided responsibilities rather than shared responsibilities.

Article [6] includes the issue of quality and quality assurance in career guidance, though there is no clear agreed international understanding of what quality career guidance should look like. By some reviews, they identify six main areas which may be quality assured and provides a new theory of approaches to assuring quality. They highlight the need for caution so that the pursuit of quality does not underestimate the goals it seeks to achieve.

The paper [7] focuses on the significance of career guidance and counselling, the consequence of career guidance and student counselling, purposes of counselling and guidance, characteristics of career counselling and influential factors in career guidance and student counselling.

Article [8] shows the case study that examines secondary science teachers' responses to a professional development program designed to assist in the transformation of inquiry belief structures and inquiry instructional practices. It provides the perception of teachers' belief structures and classroom structure related to inquiry instruction.

Paper [9] shows the working and implementation of online career counselling websites. These websites include data on different career options and colleges which the students can select. On some websites, different types of tests are available for students so that they can know about their talents.

Article [10] is focusing on a case study of designing an online platform for counselling. In this study, three steps are done. In the first part, the Website was designed. In the second part, with the help of expert opinion, websites efficiency was checked. In the last part, the students were assigned counselling depending on various factors. As a result, it shows that face to face or online meetings are much better than control groups.

The paper [11] aims to display the results of the need for career counselling among students from Politehnica University of Bucharest. They chose a comparative approach for understanding the needs of counselling for students from study years I, II and III and they find that career counselling differs from one study year to the other.

In Article [12] investigation of the effects of student career choice guidance on identity, development is done. In this, they compared the levels of identity development before and after the guidance. As a result, it shows that students showed a significant increase in commitment strength in the career and present domains.

The journal [13] discusses the career guidance and counselling services that are very important in an effort to help people who lost their job due to pandemic covid-19 as well as the workers in general. This problem can be solved through career guidance as a treatment to help individuals to overcome their career-related problems. Through providing career guidance services as a remedy students will gather self-motivation to rise from losses and get a new career that matches their interests and finds another source of income for their living.

Paper [14] represents the data from a large Indian survey to describe the differential impact of socio-economic status on career preparation self-efficacy, the perception of career development barriers and career beliefs. The psycho-social factors that are intertwined with the perpetuation of social exclusion are delineated and the role that career counselling could play to empower the socially excluded to engage with life chances is discussed.

The journal [15] describes the practical tools to use with a Chaos theory of career approaches such as assessments, card sorts and counselling strategies. The impact of this approach is discussed in theory. It is concluded that this approach provides the most coherent and comprehensive account behaviour for a career development that can incorporate both modernist and postmodernist perspectives.

In Article [16] the study is done which assess the effects of family income and career guidance and counselling experiences on changes in career maturity during the transition from high school to college. This study used data from Youth Panel 2007 collected by Korea Employment Information Service. They include 456 adolescents who were high school students in the first and third waves of the survey and college students in the fifth wave of the survey. The results suggested that family income was a significant factor affecting the career maturity of scholars. The experience of career guidance and counselling while in high school had a positive impact on the career maturity of students even after entering college.

III. METHODOLOGY

In our proposed system, as the internet continues to grow in popularity, immense new opportunities arise, when it comes to immediate access to expert advice and information from a career counsellor.




Fig 1. Data Flow Diagram for working of website




Fig 2. Working of call scheduling.




Fig 4. Homepage of website




Fig 5. Database of monthly stats




Fig 6. Analog stats

The database includes the information of users in different ways i.e statics(fig.5) and analogue stats(fig.6) for developers so that they can easily look into requests in a mannered way.
